1. Stocks in Store: (Page 2)

- Country stocks increased to 2.97 MMT in Week 45 utilizing 56% of the system's working capacity. Space in primary elevators is good.
- Total western port terminal stocks increased to 1.33 MMT in Week 45, utilizing 69% of the working capacity.

2. Country Deliveries: (Page 3)

• Deliveries to primary elevators were 0.99 MMT in Week 45.

3. Port Performance: (Pages 3-5)

- Total western port unloads were 8% higher than the 4-week moving average and 54% higher than Week 45 last year.
- West Coast unloads were 6,639 cars (5,861 and Prince Rupert 778), 5% higher than the 4-week moving average and 64% higher than Week 45 last year.
- Thunder Bay had 2,213 unloads, 14% higher than the 4-week moving average and 30% higher than Week 45 last year.
- The total average terminal out-of-car time (OCT) increased to 17.0% from 12.4% the previous week. The OCT for Week 45 was 20.1% at Vancouver and 8.3% at Thunder Bay. At the time of publishing, Prince Rupert had not yet reported Week 45 OCT.

4. Shipments: (Page 5)

• Year-to-date Western Canadian shipments from port terminal elevators at Week 45 are 12% higher than the same period last year and 5% higher than the 3-year average.

5. Vessels: (Page 5)

- Vancouver vessel lineup for Week 46 2024-25 decreased to 17 vessels (The current one-year average at Vancouver is 25 vessels). Of the 17, 6 were at berth, 8 were anchored at English Bay, 1 was anchored at Burrard Inlet, and 2 were anchored at Vancouver Island.
- Prince Rupert vessel lineup for Week 46 2024-25 increased to 4 vessels (The current one-year average at Prince Rupert is 4 vessels).
- Vessels cleared from Vancouver was 10 and from Prince Rupert was 0 in Week 46 2024-25.






1-A2 Weekly Country Stocks in Store

1-C Weekly Stock Balance









3-C Western Port Terminal Unloads (cars), Total by Carrier, This Year vs. Last Year and the 3-Year Average









3-D Vancouver Terminal Unloads (cars), Total by Carrier, This Year vs. Last Year and the 3-Year Average


3-E Prince Rupert Terminal Unloads (cars), Total by Carrier, This Year vs. Last Year and the 3-Year Average






4-B Weekly Shipments ('000 tonnes) from Port Terminals - This Year vs Last Year and the 3-Year Average










5-C Vessel Lineup at Prince Rupert as of Week 46 2024-25
